

What they need to bring to school each day:


- A bag that will fit in the lockers!


Reading Records

- Homework diaries will be checked at school every Friday and children will stick in their new homework for the week.






P.E.

Marking

- Children take ownership of their work.
- There will be no written feedback from adults written in their books
- Adult will stamp child book and then adult/child will write what they need to do in green pen
- We will still be assessing the children's work and will be discussing their learning with them rather than in a comment at the end of the day.

Behaviour

- This week, we devised a behaviour agreement as a class focused around the three words of respect, learning and safety. This can also be found on the website.
- We expect every child to come to school with the intention of learning and be punctual every day.
- We expect every child to have a high expectation for their learning and for their behaviour.
- We expect every child to take pride in their learning, their school and each other.
