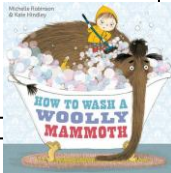

<u>Due 24.4.26</u>	Rule: Sometimes the letter <b>a</b> doesn't say its short sound /a/ like in <i>cat</i> . Instead, it makes the <b>/ar/</b> sound like in <i>car</i> . This usually happens when <b>a comes before certain letters</b> . The letter <b>a</b> often makes the <b>/ar/</b> sound when it comes before: <b>f, s, th, sk, sp, st, nt, nch</b>
